### “Why don’t you people just get over it?”...An Indigenous Perspective on Reconciliation

Canada’s colonial history, the racist attitudes and assumptions that are a part of Canadian society, and today’s statistical realities are complicated. While the political climate of Canada is changing, we still have a long way to go. Within the past year, there has been a significant shift in the status quo – from deeply rooted attitudes and stereotypes that question why Indigenous peoples simply can’t “get over it” to an understanding of the intergenerational impacts of colonization and a national call to all Canadians for a commitment to truth and reconciliation.

She also has vast board and governance experience including serving in various capacities with the National Centre for First Nations Governance, First Nations Statistical Institute, Aboriginal Peoples Television Network and Board of Regents for Memorial University. Presently, Ms. White is the Assistant Deputy Minister of Indigenous Affairs with the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador.
