Mandatory CLE Program - Late Filing Fee

In accordance with Law Society Rule 6.20, a member who fails to file their Annual CLE Report, in compliance with the Mandatory CLE Requirements, on or before the required deadline will be assessed a \$500.00 late fee (plus applicable taxes) and shall be referred to the Vice-President who may take further action as described therein.

Amendments to the *Criminal Code* and Permitted Appearances by Students
