### NOTICE TO THE PROFESSION AND GENERAL PUBLIC PUBLIC AND MEDIA ATTENDANCE AT REMOTE HEARINGS

**Issued: June 1, 2020**

The Court of Appeal is hearing appeals by way of videoconference or teleconference. To ensure that the public and the media continue to have access to these proceedings, the Court of Appeal provides the following guidelines for attendance at remote hearings.

If you wish to attend one of the matters listed on the docket, you must contact the Court of Appeal Registry at least **48 hours prior** to the hearing in question. The Court of Appeal Registry may be contacted by email at [coaregistry@appeal.court.nl.ca](mailto:coaregistry@appeal.court.nl.ca)

Requests should indicate the **file number, case name** and **date** of the hearing you wish to attend. If the matter is one that the public would ordinarily be able to attend, you will be given a teleconference number so you may call in to listen to the proceedings.

The Court of Appeal will attempt to accommodate requests to attend made within the 48 hours prior to the hearing of the matter. Where these requests cannot be accommodated, the Court will provide a copy of the sound recording of the hearing at no cost to the requestor. Members of the public and the media may still make a request for a copy of the sound recording of the hearing after a matter has been heard (assuming there is no restriction on public access to the hearing), subject to the payment of the \$20 fee.
