Commissioner of Lobbyists (Part-Time)

The Commissioner of Lobbyists will report annually on activities of the office to House of Assembly through the Speaker.

The Commissioner is responsible for investigating alleged violations of the **Lobbyist Registration Act** or the Lobbyist Code of Conduct, denying or canceling a lobbyist's registration where the Act or Code has been breached, and ordering, upon application, that some or all registration information be kept confidential. The Commissioner may also recommend changes to the Code of Conduct.

The Commissioner should possess knowledge of lobbying activities, as well as associated legislation and code of conduct information. The ideal candidate will support the continuous improvements of the office; ensure the Commissioner has a strong and active presence; and maintain the integrity of the office.

This position requires the ability to use sound judgment when rendering complex and sensitive decisions based on statutory requirements and legal principles.

The successful candidate will manage a diverse workload with a commitment to well informed and timely decision-making. Demonstrated analytical and communication skills, and ability to meet performance expectations will be critical to success.

The successful candidate must also have the ability to work independently as an objective decision maker while maintaining the confidentiality and ethical standards of conduct necessary for this position.

Investigative experience and the ability to prepare and deliver presentations is also required. The skills and knowledge required would normally be obtained through progressive related experience supplemented by a degree in law.

The person appointed shall hold office for a term of five years and may be reappointed for further terms. The Commissioner of Lobbyists is a part-time position and is required to work a minimum of 10 hours per week.
