Report Insurance Claims Before Policy Year End

The current professional liability insurance policy for practising members expires on 30 June 2025. To protect your coverage, it is essential to report any circumstances that could potentially give rise to a claim before this date.

If you are aware of any issues, such as a possible error in the provision of professional services or if you have received allegations (even if unfounded), please complete the Reporting Form and submit it to Janice Ringrose, Insurance & Risk Manager, at insurance@lawsociety.nf.ca.

Timely reporting ensures that the Lawyers' Insurance Programme is put on notice within the current policy year. This step is crucial to preserving your coverage under the existing policy.
