



EXCEPTIONS, PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES

EXCEPTIONS include:

- ✓ Humanitarian Activities
- √ Fulfill prior contracts
- ✓ Diplomatic relations

Minister of Foreign Affairs may issue:

✓ PERMIT

✓ to authorize specific activities otherwise prohibited by SEMA and JVCFOA

✓ CERTIFICATE

✓ To authorize specific activities otherwise prohibited by UN Sanctions



Why does sanctions compliance matter?

- Adhere with sanctions legislation
- Prevent money laundering by sanctioned individuals and entities
- Prevent illegal transactions
- Protect your reputation
- Remain compliant with law society rules and professional conduct obligations



Sanctions screening and due diligence

- Subscribe to the Global Affairs Canada Sanctions Bureau distribution list
- Verify if any client you plan to deal with is listed under any of the following sanctions lists:

Consolidated Canadian Autonomous Sanctions List

Consolidated UN sanctions list

- Consult the <u>sanctions legislation and associated regulations</u> implemented by Canada against the countries of individuals or entities you plan on dealing with
- Document your assessment process, decisions or legal advice.



Questions to consider...

- □ Are there any indirect associations between my client and sanctioned persons? For example, any indirect dealings with a sanctioned person through associates, family members, subsidiaries, parent/holding company, intermediary bank, etc?
- □ Does the activity involve the **import** or the **export** of prohibited goods?
- □ Does the activity involve the **provision** of prohibited services to a sanctioned individual or entity (even indirectly), and/or the **provision** of prohibited technical assistance or technical data?
- ☐ Am I in any way **facilitating** a sanctions contravention?



- Contravening sanctions is a **criminal** offence
- Sanctions must be respected by all persons in Canada or abroad
- Penalties for contravening sanctions:

SEMA and JVCFOA maximum penalties

- Summary conviction \$25,000 fine / 1-year prison term
- Conviction on indictment 5year prison term

UNA maximum penalties

- Summary conviction \$100,000 fine / 1-year prison term
- Conviction on indictment 10year prison term
