5. Strategic Planning Work Plan

General Discussion about Strategic Work Plan

The Executive Director, Brenda B. Grimes, KC, referred Benchers to the Strategic Work Plan that is posted on the portal which is updated prior to every Benchers' meeting. She noted that there have been some jurisdictional scans completed and some are underway, but that they will not be presented to Benchers until recommendations in relation to the initiatives proposed are ready.

With respect to the priority to Promote Reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples, Ms. Grimes noted that the Executive Director, the President and Bencher, Johnathan Earle, plan to travel to Labrador at the same time as the Executive Director of Public Legal Information Association of Newfoundland and Labrador, around mid-January, 2026, to help broaden the Law Society's connections there.

Strategic Initiative – Enhance Competence – Provide Education Relating to the Use of Artificial Intelligence in the Practice of Law

Benchers were provided with a memo from the Executive Director which included an overview of AI in the contemporary legal environment, the types of AI used in legal practice and their applications, the advantages and risks/limitations of AI in legal practice and best practices for responsible AI adoption.

The Executive Director thanked the Director of Admissions and Education for his work on the memo. She noted that it will provide a foundation for ongoing discussion and future resource development.
